Advertising & Commemorative Carnival Glass Lettered Pieces



Brazier's Candies

Maker Fenton

Fenton used the Garden Mums pattern to make advertising premiums. A few pieces have enameled lettering.

This is one of the advertising pieces.

The National Confectioners Association took an educated guess that this company probably was from the Western Great Lakes Region, which was a hotbed of candy manufacturing in the early 1900's. Known only in the amethyst color, in handgrip & flat plates and in a six ruffled bowl.

These two plates sold at the Seck auction of Dr. Jacks carnival glass.

Average selling price is around \$700.00.

PERSIAN GARDEN



This intricate pattern was a very popular pattern made by the Dugan Glass Company from 1910 – 1915. This bowl and stand was sold as a fruit bowl set. There were two molds for this pattern. The larger was used on the fruit set. The base is the Big Basketweave vase mold that has been ruffled. Not all of the fruit bowls are ruffled. A very few have been found in the round punch bowl shape. The exterior pattern is usually always the Basketweave Variant.

Fruit sets have been found in Marigold, Amethyst, Peach Opal, White and Lavender.

This beautiful amethyst set sold at the 2004 Texas Carnival Glass Convention for \$1,450.00.

X Diamond & Daisy Cut



This is a U.S. Glass Company product. It is also known as Mayflower & Floral and Diamond Band. The water sets, in this pattern, show up more often in the Indiana area. The U.S. Glass Company operated factories at Gas City, Indiana and Tiffin, Ohio, which possibly could account for that.

A 16 point star type figure is impressed into the bottom of the base. The tumblers have been reported only in marigold and were made from a two part mold. They were produced in the late 1920's so were much later than most carnival glass tumblers.

December 10, 1966

Water Pitcher in Rare Pattern Brings Record Carnival Price
When Sold by the Finders, the Rex Lyons, of Marion, Ind.

The Frolicking Bears carnival tumbler is no longer an orphan!

A matching dark water pitcher in this pattern—the first such pitcher ever Reported—was discovered and bought late last Summer by Mr. and Mrs. Rex Lyons, Marion, Ind., charter members of the SCGC.

The news of the pitcher's existence and, later, it—spread from coast to coast, stirring the imagination of scores of carnival glass collectors. The pitcher then brought a record high price for carnival glass when disposed of at a private sale late in October to another SCGC couple residing in the East.

Anxious for SCGC members, through the News to have the correct information first, Mrs. Lyons sent some details and three color pictures of the pitcher.

Mrs. Lyons said that while they were unable to supply every detail concerning the discovery at this time, they could tell much of the fascinating story. For example, she wrote that “the pitcher was first bought at a country rummage sale. It just stood around for two or three days. It was handled by many collectors and dealers who passed it up since they did not realize that it might be rare.”

“The pitcher finally was bought by a dealer and a little later was brought to our attention by a picker who described it to us.” We received other reports that the rare pitcher had been discovered in northern Indiana and that the Lyons had bought it from a dealer, who also did not really appreciate its great rarity. Mrs. Lyons continued; “You can't imagine what a thrill it was for us to buy and own the Bear pitcher. While we would have liked to have kept it in our collection, and some wonder why we did not, we had personal reasons for letting it go.”



The pitcher is 8 3/8" in height, and the diameter across the top, from handle to the lip is 7 1/4". Diameter of the base is 4 inches.

President Leslie Wolfe of Villa Grove, Ill., president of the SCGC, owns the only known Bear tumbler on display in the nation. He described the pitcher as follows; "This is a medium-sized tankard pitcher resting on a round and flared collar base.

Judging from the photos, and from the word of those who have handled the pitcher, it is of smoked olive green. The iridescence is average with none of the bright highlights found on many carnival pieces.

"It has a lovely tree-bark handle. The overall lines of the pitcher are quite simple compared to the impressive detail of the bears in their many festive moods. At the top and bottom of the pitcher is a heavy grape vine with bunches of grapes in various positions. However, this is overshadowed by the intricacy of the detail of the bears. "The tumbler in my collection is apparently a perfect match.

Handle Is Damaged

Several collectors reported that the handle of the rare pitcher was damaged. One reputable dealer-collector who examined the pitcher confirmed this. He said; "The damage is at the top of the handle where it is attached to the body of the pitcher.

There is a chip there and it appears to be cracked (the handle) as well."

It is thought possible by some that the damage spot may have been the reason why so many persons passed it up at the original sale. However, the damage certainly had little effect on the tremendous value of this rare item, as proved by the sale.

As for the price that the water pitcher brought, first reports that reached Kansas City set the asking price at \$3,600! This was scaled down later. We were told that it sold for between \$2,500 and \$3,000. We believe the price was \$2800.00.

Series III Hatpins

Some of these hatpins are going to be rare but that doesn't always effect the price. The dark hatpins are usually on black glass and the color is from the iridescence. Unlike most Carnival shapes, there is little known about the provenance of hatpins. Some are found marked with the word "Geschutzt," which means protected or patented in German. Czechoslovakia is also believed to have been the origin for many. More hatpins will be in our next issue.



Jute Braid

Sometimes called Basketweave Variant. "Jute" is the name for a grass fiber of an East Indian plant used for sacking, burlap and twine. It is 1 1/2" in diameter with a 1/4" border which is lightly faceted. These hatpins bring From \$80.00 to \$125.00.



Laurel Jewel

This is a rare hatpin from the collection of Carl & Eunice Booker. It is 1 7/8" in diameter on black glass. It has a 1/4" laurel wreath around the edge and a square braid surrounds the faceted jewel.



Leaf and Veil

This is a highly desirable hatpin. It is 1 5/8" in diameter. The detail has an embroidered effect on the scallops veiling and leaves. The center is faceted. These hatpins often bring between \$600.00 & \$750.00.

Looped Buckle

This pretty hatpin sold for \$200.00 at a 2003 auction.



Lots of Diamonds

The entire center of this hatpin is covered with small diamonds. One of these hatpins sold for \$60.00 at a 2002 auction.



Marvelous

A petal center with a ring of rhinestones. This one sold for \$500.00 in 1995.



Metal Framed

A flat iridized disk with metal design over that. Five similar pieces sold as a lot for \$105.00 each in 1995. In 1998, five others sold for \$10.00 to \$25.00.


